

Symposium on 'management of rural resources in era of globalisation' held

Under the joint aegis of Centre for studies of Social Exclusion and inclusive policies and Rural Management Department of Babasaheb Bhimrao Ambedkar University (BBAU), a symposium on 'Operationalising, holistic development by managing rural resources in the era of globalisation' was organised at Conference Hall on Wednesday.

Kamal Taori, IAS, while speaking on 'Global Vision and Local Action', said in this era of globalisation, villages were not getting just treatment because of fast developments and due to lack of proper management, capabilities and resources of villages have not been completely utilised for the development action and management. "Because of these shortcomings in the system, the development of the nation is getting affected," he added.

He said within 60 years of independence, people have



destroyed the developmental thinking of the legends like Mahatma Gandhi, and Vinobha Bhave. As a result in the cities and villages, different cultural are developing. "In the cities, culture of earning loads of money is gaining momentum while in villages due to orthodox beliefs, people are facing exploitation. All these practices are gaining strength in the era of globalisation," he added.

He informed that in the areas, the malpractice of female foeticide has gained strength. "In the era of man-

agement and global development, the villages are used as 'Business Hub.' And by using the resources of villages, they can be attached to the main stream of global development,"

IAS officer SP Gupta said in this era of globalisation, the universities and the colleges should organise several programmes at their level for the students of rural areas through which they could learn those things about development and management. All this would prove helpful in the enforcement of total development scheme.
