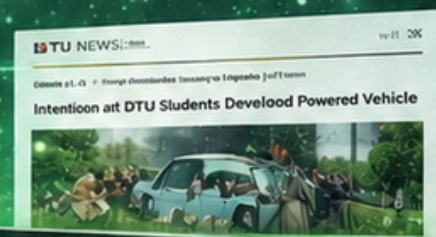
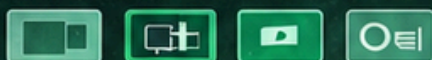

DTU Hosts AIIS Delegation for Symposium on Environment and Sustainability







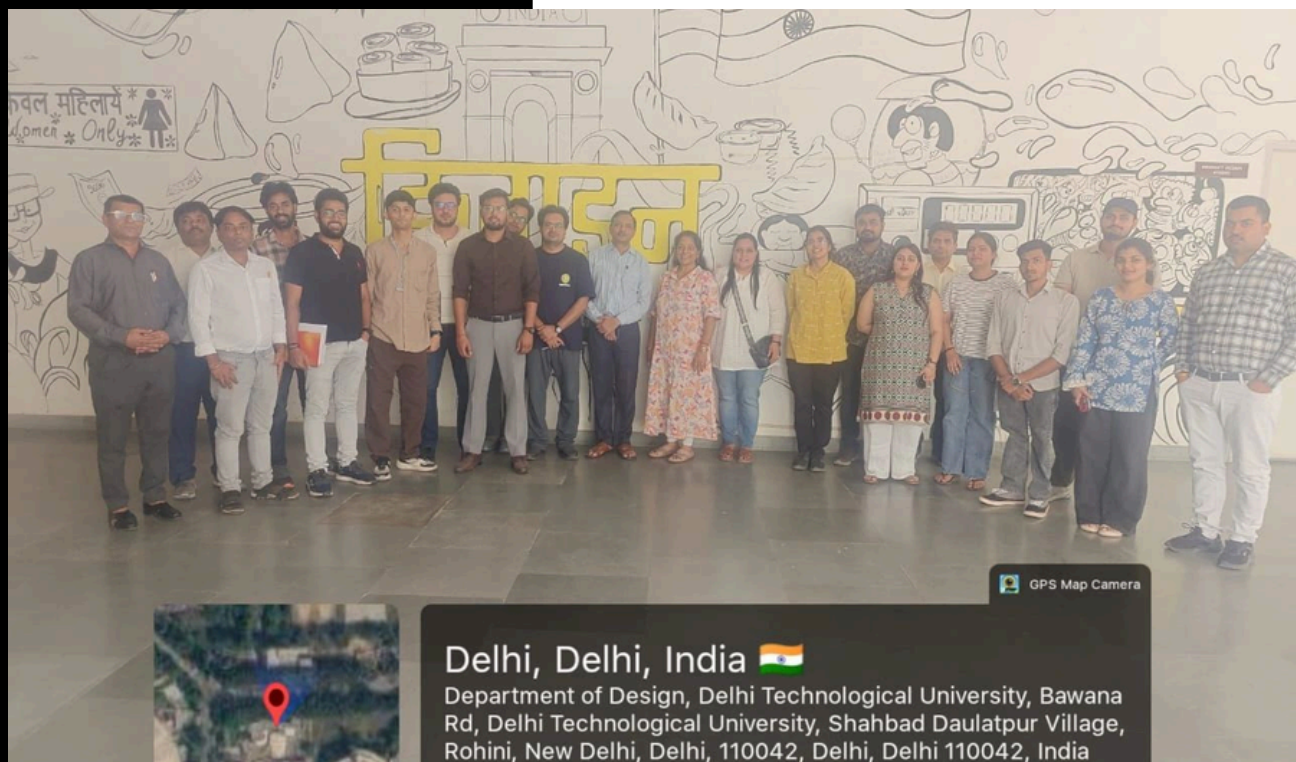
